Topics include in-home services, community resources, help with applying for benefits, Medicare information, caregiver support and more. Margie has compiled a handy resource booklet tailored to our local area. The 40-page Guide to Community Services for Older Adults and Their Families is available for free at the Patty Turner Center. PTC Social Services is a partnership between West Deerfield Township and the Deerfield Park District. Service is friendly, free, and confidential.

## Grant Money Available!

The West Deerfield Township Accessibility Grant for disabled residents is aimed at improving quality of life through increased access to the community. Grants up to \$1000 per household per year may be awarded. Expenses which may qualify for this program include things like home modifications, mobility equipment, adaptive communication devices, some therapies, etc. Older adults are encouraged to apply!! The program is intended to assist those WDT residents with the greatest financial need, but there is no stated income limit. Application forms are available at PTC, the township office, and online. ## You’re Getting a New Medicare Card!

The rollout is beginning!! Cards will be mailed between April 2018 – April 2019. Why? Social Security numbers are being removed to help keep your information more secure and protect your identity. You’ll get a new Medicare number that’s unique to you, and it will only be used for your Medicare coverage. The new card won’t change your coverage or benefits. You’ll get more information from Medicare when your new card is mailed. Here’s how you can get ready: Make sure your mailing address is up to date. If your address needs to be corrected, contact Social Security at [ssa.gov/myaccount](http://ssa.gov/myaccount) or 1-800-772-1213. Beware of scammers who may call you to ask personal or private information. Medicare will NOT call you. Understand that mailing everyone a new card will take some time. Your card might arrive at a different time than your friend’s or neighbor’s.

The Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP) is FREE service offered nationwide that provides FREE counseling and information about Medicare, including Trained volunteers are ready to answer your questions and PTC is a host site. ## Real Estate Assessment Exemption Workshop *Monday, May 7th from 1:00-3:00pm*

The Chief County Assessment Office and Township Assessors will be at The Patty Turner Center to assist residents in completing the 2018 Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze Application for taxes payable in 2019, and to help taxpayers sign up for other appropriate exemptions. Residents will work with a staff member one-on-one to complete necessary forms. Qualifications for the Assessment Freeze are 65 or older, own and live in the property for the past two Jan 1; income \$65,000 or less. Bring your 2017 tax return, and Social Security Statement (SSA-1099) and proof of beneficiary if the house is held in a Trust. No appointment required.

If you are age 65+ or totally disabled AND have income less than \$27,610 as an individual or \$36,635 as a couple, you can apply for the Benefit Access Program. You may be entitled to a big reduction in your Secretary of State License Plate renewal sticker and get the RTA Senior Rides FREE card! If you're already part of the program, it is suggested you renew at the first opportunity, which is three months prior to expiration. The application is good for two years. ALL applications and documentation must be submitted online; no paper forms exist. You can do it yourself at the Illinois Department on Aging's website. Residents of Deerfield, West Deerfield Township, and PTC members may make an appointment with Margie and she will do it for you!! Also, the Village of Deerfield offers resident who are seniors LIHEAP recipients (monthly income <\$1471 for individuals) the village sticker for just \$1.
