Pickleball Proposal

Ken Andre and Michael Woldorf presented a Lease Proposal from North Shore Pickleball Academy. They are interested in running pickleball programs at Sachs Recreation Center. These programs would co-exist with the tennis program. The proposal allows for one or both tennis courts to remain with the inclusion of eight professional-grade pickleball courts. Analysis of park district tennis programs show that more participants are between the ages of 4 to 10 years old. Many experts and teaching professionals recognized the benefits of teaching younger tennis students on a smaller court because it provides a more conducive environment for learning the basic skills of tennis more effectively. The proposal includes entering into a three-year lease with the park district to implement a pickleball program at Sachs.

President Caron stated that the park district prefers to keep the programs in-house and the district isn't interested in the proposal at this time. The park district isn't interested in running a pickleball facility as we run a recreation center that includes more opportunities than pickleball. Vice-President Patinkin feels that the board should hold a workshop meeting to discuss in more detail.

Salary & Wage Inflationary Adjustment Discussion

Upon request from a Commissioner and support from the Board President, the concept of adjustment of staff salaries and wages was placed on the agenda for discussion and possible action. As we all know, the continued rise in inflation has decreased consumer spending limits in many areas including gasoline, shelter and food. Other contributing indexes to inflation include household furnishings, medical care and motor vehicle insurance. Citing the Bureau of Labor statistics, all items within the Consumer Price Index have risen 8.5 percent over the last 12 months.

Provided are three potential scenarios of wage and salary adjustments for district full-time staff. The scenarios are based on assuming a July1, 2022 adjustment across the board and provide total fiscal impact numbers for 3, 4 and 5% adjustments. The scenarios include additional costs of FICA, Pension

and Sick Leave Payout impacts. All three scenarios do fall within the appropriation limits of the district's budget.
