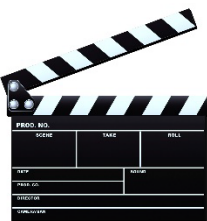

You can do it yourself on the Illinois Department on Aging's website. PTC members can also make an appointment with Margie for assistance too!
